New Faces at the Parish Council

Following permission from Uttlesford District Council to co-opt to fill two vacancies local residents Hywel Jones and Andrew Parker have both joined the Parish Council. The Parish Council has also appointed a new Youth representative, Will Bennett. The Youth Council representative will help young people in Felsted to have a voice and contribute a younger point of view to council deliberations.

We welcome Hywel, Andrew and Will to the Parish Council and we look forward to working with them.

Box Clever at Willows Green

The telephone box at Willows Green has been given a new lease of life with the installation of a lifesaving defibrillator. A defibrillator can provide vital treatment for people in cardiac arrest and they are really simple and easy to use - they are designed for use by someone who has NOT received any training.

There are very simple instructions (given verbally, you don't have to read instructions) to attach the pads to the patient and then the defibrillator does its own test to decide whether or not to shock the patient. If a shock is not needed then the defibrillator will not deliver it. We'd like to remind you that if you suspect someone is suffering from a heart attack always call 999 first.

The telephone box was originally home to a book exchange, and after consultation with the residents of Willows Green the Parish Council has installed some new book shelving in the telephone box, so that books can sit alongside the defibrillator, thus making the most of a very small space. This will once again be a brilliant facility for the Willows Green Community.

On the Right Path

Felsted are lucky to have the Parish Paths Partnership volunteer group who have been working hard over the recent months to keep Felsted's footpaths clear by replacing markers, clearing brambles and making sure paths are passable where they can.

After a spring and summer punctuated with sunshine and showers, Essex County Council are reporting an extremely heavy growth of vegetation. This has affected footpaths all around Felsted and it means that some of the footpaths are still quite overgrown. The Parish Council are aware of this and will report any incidents of overgrown footpaths you tell us about



to the Highways Department at Essex County Council to rectify. Please be aware that residents can also report issues themselves by using the Essex County Council Website <https://www.essexhighways.org/tell-us/problem-check>

Keep Felsted Tidy

Janet's Recipes

Almond And Pear Tart

I acquired this recipe from the hosts of at a chalet in the French Alps and it has become a family favourite. It is a great way to use this year's pear harvest, or you can cheat and use tinned pears

INGREDIENTS

Tart

- Ready-made shortcrust pastry
- 75g/4oz butter
- 75g/4oz caster sugar
- 75g/4oz ground almonds
- 25g/1oz plain flour
- 1 egg beaten
- 1 egg yolk
- 2 poached pears OR 4 tinned pear halves sliced evenly
- 1tbsp apricot jam

Poaching Liquid if required

- 1½ pints water
- 225g/8oz sugar
- cinnamon stick (optional)

METHOD

If using fresh pears, peel, core and poach pears for 5-15 minutes until soft (allow to cool).

- Heat oven to 180 degrees/350C/Mark 4
- Line a flan dish with pastry and chill until needed
- Beat together butter and sugar until fluffy
- Mix in ground almonds, flour, beaten egg and yolk.
- Fill the pastry case and level with a spatula
- Place the pear slices on top, pressing slightly
- Bake for 45-50 minutes (check after 40 minutes)
- Bring jam to boil with 1tbsp water, and brush over flan whilst still warm



Blooming Great!

Led by David Dempsey, a small team of green fingered volunteers who maintain our flower tubs ensure that Felsted is dressed in fabulous floral finery all year round.

David has lived in Felsted for over 60 years and for 25 years has led a committed team of local residents, who plant our lovely tubs and troughs in spring and autumn. From a relatively modest 11 tubs and 4 troughs back in the 1990's, such has been the pleasure the displays have brought, the number of tubs has now doubled to 22 and a couple of more troughs have also been added to produce the annual flower shows. The tubs are not only to be found in the village centre. This year both Crix Green and Cock Green are enjoying flower power, courtesy of David and the team.

David began this labour of love in 1996 as an assistant to Betty Smith. Since then, David principally aided by Brian Grimshaw and the redoubtable George Bellingham-Smith, reckon they have planted more than 20,000 bedding plants in the annual displays. And compost? Oh yes! Approaching 40 tons of the stuff! This summer alone, over 600 plants and 62 bags of compost have been used to produce the enviable show.

Tubs and troughs are planted and refreshed twice a year. In May, hundreds of marigolds, salvias and alyssum were planted to take over



from the tired perennial polyanthus that had brightened the winter months. In October the cycle begins again. David and the team will remove the summer annuals and new polyanthus will return to brighten the winter and take us through to next spring. The summer bedding plan changes annually but the polyanthus are welcome and reliable regulars in our displays.

Blooming Great!

"The hardest part of keeping this going is the planning." Said David. "We couldn't do this without the help and total commitment of wonderful local people like George Bellingham-Smith, Brian Grimshaw and our volunteer planters and waterers.

We used to use George's trailer to shift the big 50Kg bags of compost. But unlike George, his trailer has been pensioned off! Fortunately, Brian Grimshaw came to the rescue with his trailer and it's an essential for the team. We couldn't do without it.

Planting the tubs twice a year is actually the easiest part, it doesn't take that long at all. With the volunteers we can do the whole lot in under two hours. It's the daily watering and dead heading that the volunteers undertake, particularly in the summer, to keep the plants looking fresh, that is the really hard and time-consuming part. They are the backbone of this operation."

The plants and compost are paid for by the Parish Council and bought by David from Bourne Brook Nurseries at Greensted Green. David and the team ensure that dead organic summer material is taken for recycling and lucky parishioners get to share the 'evicted' perennials in May!

Was David a horticulturalist by profession? Not all. David ran his own business, for many years producing plastic and acrylic mouldings, including those very familiar salt and pepper mills. "They were everywhere. My wife and I even saw small versions on Concorde!" Said David. Fortunately for Felsted, in more recent years David's efforts have been more ground-based but no less supersonic!

Planning in Felsted

The Focus Editorial team are occasionally asked to include details of either upcoming or recent decisions on Planning Applications within the Parish in the Focus magazine.

Unfortunately, this is not possible due both to timing issues and the space reports would require. As an example, as I write this in early August, the minutes of the most recent July Planning Committee meeting ran to 13 A4 pages of text! This included 10 pages of submission to the Planning Inspectorate about the Appeal for a potential “Gypsy and Traveller site” on Chelmsford Road in Causeway End. That report alone would take the whole of a couple of issues the Focus!

Fortunately, for those of you who want to monitor planning issues, if you have access to the internet it is quite easy to find details of current planning applications or the Parish Council’s Planning Committee responses to recent applications.

Here’s how.

Go to the Parish Council Website (<https://www.felsted-pc.gov.uk/>). Under the “Meetings & Documents” tab you will find a list of both Agenda’s and Minutes. By selecting the next “Planning Committee meeting” agenda you will see a list of all current applications with the Uttlesford District Council (UDC) reference number highlighted in blue. This is a live link to the UDC planning Website. Clicking on the blue highlighted link will take you directly to the application you are interested in.

On the UDC Website, under the “documents” tab for the application, you will find all details of the application including location, layout, site plans and any submitted responses from residents. By registering, you can also comment on any “open” application by clicking on the “make a comment” tab. Alternatively you can submit comments via email to: planning@uttlesford.gov.uk (making sure to include the application reference number), or by post to planning at UDC.

In the interests of “openness and transparency” it is important also to note that all full Felsted Parish Council and Planning Committee meetings are always open to the public. The agenda will state whether attendance can be “in person” or via “Zoom” (if via “Zoom” - please email the Parish Clerk for the link). UDC is the statutory Local Planning Authority; Felsted Parish Council has no power to accept or refuse planning applications but is invited by UDC to comment on all applications (or HM Inspectorate in the case of Appeals) and is therefore a consultee, in the same way as residents of the Parish can comment.

Felsted CHRISTMAS Unlocked!

DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' CORNER:

A Local Plan, why do we need one? Well, as you may recall every District Council needs one. This will contain development policies for our district up to 2040, so that the right facilities and infrastructure are in place to support our communities and to grow the local economy. Every Local Plan must contain policies that will include for example provision for: housing, employment, landscape, green spaces, and heritage, among others.

All information discussed below about the Local Plan can be accessed easily via the UDC website on: <https://www.uttlesford.gov.uk/new-local-plan> Why not have a look if you have a spare five minutes, and you might even consider registering your interest to be kept advised of updates. The initial Consultation exercise was conducted through a series of 'Themed' presentations and the Stakeholder Forums and ran from November 2020 to April 2021. All of the comments then made will help to draft an initial version of the Local Plan that will be ready for consultation in the spring of 2022. All comments made are available to read and are easily accessible through the website.

The biggest and possibly most emotive issue in all Local Plans concerns the number of dwellings that need to be planned for and their locations. The number required is not plucked out of the air but is one that is calculated and imposed by the Government for each individual Local Authority and has to be achieved through their Local Plan. Uttlesford has been given 706 dwellings as its annual requirement district wide and which will run through every year until 2040. Therefore, that is why there was a 'Call for Sites' which lists the land submitted by their owners as potentially "available" for housing, for employment land and for the first time, green spaces. Just because an owner submits a site, it does not mean that it will be allocated in the draft plan. In fact, the 299 sites submitted district wide would provide about six times more dwellings than is required for the local plan.

To aid the council reach the evidenced led decisions on the submitted sites, they have been assessed over the summer and will go for a technical consultation to check that all the factual information submitted about each site is correct. This will go to all Town and Parish Councils and Felsted PC will be consulted in the Autumn. You can see every site that has been submitted on the interactive map via a link above. The next consultation is scheduled for March 2022 which is called 'the Draft (Regulation 18) Local Plan' stage and this is a consultation that we would encourage you to take part in. We will write more about this stage closer to the time.

A sad goodbye...

to the Purple Beech in the Churchyard

As reported in the “Summer Edition”, issue 12 of the Felsted Focus magazine regrettably it was necessary to arrange the felling of one of the much loved beech trees that dominate the centre of the village. This has now been done and below is an explanation why this was found necessary.

During a routine triennial inspection of Parish trees the tree was found to be exhibiting internal decay that it was thought, could be severely affecting its structural integrity. It was recognised that the tree was a very impressive landmark, being situated in the churchyard behind the church and because it appeared to be in good apparent health and vigour, with no obvious visible problems, confirmation should be sought from more than one qualified arboricultural specialist that it could not be saved.

The head arboricultural officer of Uttlesford Council was consulted as the tree was subject to a Tree Preservation Order. Following his inspection he recommended that the tree should be felled due to it being deemed a hazardous tree.

A supporting independent arboricultural survey confirmed that there was a large decay cavity to the northern side of the stem from below ground level and that this decay was affecting the buttress roots to the north and east where sound tests revealed hollowing, indicating internal decay and loss of structural integrity. Other structural roots were likely to be affected similarly.

The rate of advancing decay with associated loss of structural stability through fungal establishment, (which for the technical amongst you was thought to be *Meripulis giganteus*, together with the additional colonisation with *Ganoderma* spp), necessitated felling of the tree. With the risks associated with the close proximity of the church buildings, parishioner's legitimate access to the churchyard and an informal path, the safe retention of the tree was considered unsustainable.

It is a condition of the Tree Preservation Order classification of the original tree that *“a replacement purple beech tree shall be planted adjacent to the position of the original tree during the first planting season (October- March) following felling and at a size of not less than 14cm girth”*.

It is hoped that parts of the tree can be salvaged and perhaps used to make a bench for the nature area and/or small mementos. Very thin slices of branches from the tree will be made available at the Craft Day that is featured elsewhere in this magazine for children to paint and decorate, which will then be hung on the village Christmas tree that is being planned for the centre of the village this year.

Gardening Tips



...FOR AUTUMN 2021

Summer gently fades into autumn as the days shorten and although the afternoons are warm, the nights are much cooler. The resulting morning dews revive the tired garden

Daffodils need to be planted by early September in sunny, warm positions. The bulbs should be planted at least 10 cm below the surface.

When the summer bedding is past its best, the large pots can be put to good use and planted up to produce a winter container that looks good from September to May. These containers will not need watering every day either!

Collect up your leaves as soon as they fall, but before they get wet. This will prevent them from damaging the lawn. Place the dry leaves in black plastic bin-liners, tie these up and leave somewhere shady and dry for 12 months. Then use the resulting well-rotted leaf-mould for mulching and for digging into the soil. If you do this every year, you will have a supply of rich compost every autumn.

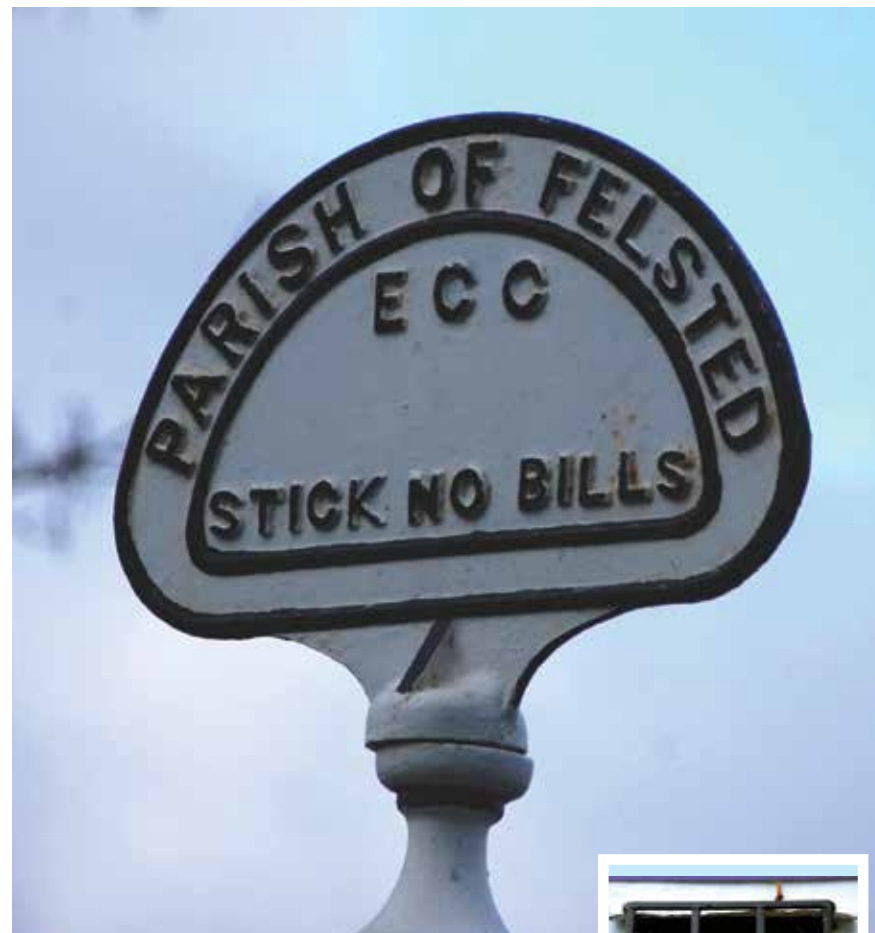
