In August we took our usual summer break but enjoyed an outing to Tiptree and a tour of the fruit fields - there were strawberries literally as far as the



# Bury Farm Development and new Doctors Surgery (Health Centre)

We are extremely pleased to report that on 31 August 2022 Uttlesford District Council's (UDC's) Planning Committee granted, by a unanimous vote, full planning permission for the Bury Farm Development in Station Road which is supported by the Felsted Neighbourhood Plan and will deliver a new Heath Centre (Doctor's Surgery) for the Parish. This was the final step in the planning process which will provide a new Health Centre for Felsted and follows the grant of "Outline Approval" by UDC in March 2021.

The full approval includes what is known as a "Section 106" agreement detailing the various legal obligations for the developer (Mulberry Homes), contractually confirming that the Health Centre (Surgery) will be built and delivered for our community.

The new Health Centre will be owned by the Felsted Community Trust (FCT). This is a new charity set up by Felsted Parish Council, whose "Objects" are "to promote community cohesion, preserve our heritage and to advance health, amateur sport, the arts and education for the public benefit of the people of Felsted Parish". The West Essex Clinical Commissioning Group (WECCG) has already agreed that it will lease the new Health Centre, securing future health provision within the Parish.


The revenue from the WECCG will go to the FCT.

We are hopeful that very soon it will be possible to indicate a potential start date for the development.

# Recipe: Reindeer cereal bars

#### REINDEER RICE CEREAL BARS

These easy child friendly rice cereal bars can be made, with supervision, by your children and are a fun challenge for younger children to decorate.

They can be made gluten and dairy free so nobody misses out on a treat.

To avoid squabbles I would advise you to use red noses for all the bars or for none, even the adults want the 'Rudolf' bar. You can push a lolly stick into these to serve.

#### **INGREDIENTS - Makes 12**

2oz/50g Block (not tub) Dairy Free Margarine 10oz/180g marshmallows (mine were pink and white)

6 cups/6 oz/170g rice cereal, (Nestle 'Go Free' are Gluten Free)

#### **DECORATIONS**

Glacé Icing (1 tablespoon icing sugar mixed with 1-2 teaspoons water to make a thick icing)

24 chocolate covered pretzels (use Schar gluten free pretzels or a GF/dairy-free brown icing pen to draw on antlers)

24 sugar eyes


12 M&M chocolates (or Skittles if Dairy Free) Sprinkles

Lolly sticks (optional)

#### Instructions:

# Grease and line two 7-8in/20-22cm sandwich cake tins with greaseproof paper

- 1) In a large pot over medium heat melt the margarine, add the marshmallows and allow to melt completely stirring regularly. Remove the pot from the heat and stir in the rice cereal until combined.
- 2) Pour the mixture into your prepared tins and press down, run a smooth bottomed glass across the surface to ensure surface is level, allow to cool completely.
- 3) Carefully run a knife around the edge of your s to release the mixture and carefully turn it out onto a board.
- 4) Cut each circle into 6 triangles.
- 5) Carefully push a lolly stick into each triangle if required.
- 6) Decorate using thick glace icing as your glue.





## **Felsted Parish Council**

#### **Pavilion Makeover**

The parish council is pleased to share that the pavilion has undergone a much-needed transformation recently. Towards the end of 2021 the pavilion was inspected, and it was found to be in dire need of some TLC, with a leaky roof, dampness and old, damaged toilets. It has taken months of work, but the pavilion is now fixed with a new roof, new toilets and the walls re-plastered and painted.

The parish council received grant funding from the Football Foundation and the District Councillor Initiative Fund which helped pay for much of the work and it is great to see this community asset looking shipshape again.

#### Walk on the Wild Side

The parish council is planning to leave sections of the greens around Felsted unmown to encourage the growth of wild grasses and flowers. These mini meadows are likely to be in the centre of the greens, so they won't obstruct drivers'/cyclists' vision. It is hoped that they bring some colour to the parish and support Felsted's butterflies, moths and bees.

#### Finding Sanctuary in Nature

There is a section of the churchyard where many of the much older graves are located that has been designated as a wildlife area. It is cut back annually, but isn't mowed regularly, to encourage wildlife to this area. This way of managing churchyards is becoming increasingly common as it offers a unique habitat for plants and wildlife to thrive in both residential and urban environments. We hope that this peaceful resting place can help wildlife conservation in Felsted.

#### Keep Felsted Tidy

The litter bins around the parish are emptied several times a week by the village attendant or Uttlesford District Council's bin collection service. There will be times, however, when the litter bins are too full to use between collections – on these occasions we would ask you to take your litter home with you and dispose of it responsibly.

#### **Emergency Defibrillators**

In a recent edition of the Felsted Focus the parish council wrote about Felsted's 3 defibrillators which are in the following locations:

- Braintree Road outside the Doctors' Surgery
- Station Road inside Linsell's Shop/Post Office
- Watch House Green outside Felsted Primary School
- Willows Green inside the old telephone box on Evelyn Road

The defibrillators have all been registered with The Circuit, which is the National Defibrillator Network, so that the emergency services can easily locate the nearest one and use it to treat someone in cardiac arrest.



# The Hundred Parishes Society

One pleasurable autumn task is the harvesting of ripened fruits from trees in your own garden. For most of us, our cooking apple will be a Bramley's Seedling and the dessert apple an Essex-bred Discovery or a Cox's Orange Pippin. Originating from central Asia, apples are incredibly varied with at least 2,000 named varieties! There are 150 named varieties in the gardens at Audley End.

In the 19th century the skilled horticulturalists at the Rivers Nursery at Sawbridgeworth bred and propagated many varieties of fruit trees, including the prolific Czar plum and Conference pear, both of which are still available today. The Conference pear features in Great Chesterford's 21st-century community orchard.

For commercial reasons, the range available from modern plant nurseries is limited to a few easy-to-grow varieties. However, hidden away in forgotten corners of long-established gardens within the Hundred Parishes there will be specimens of heritage varieties of orchard trees. If you have a flavoursome, but unidentified, variety, then the team at the East of England Apples and Orchards Project would be delighted to hear from you.

There is something special about growing a unique or local variety, so if you wish to plant heritage fruit trees specific to your own county, this organisation's catalogue lists a surprising number of varieties for Essex, Hertfordshire or Cambridgeshire apples and pears, as well as local plums, cherries and gages. This wide selection provides an opportunity to continue a long tradition of choosing something rather special to enjoy eating in future years.

The Whats On page at www.hundredparishes.org.uk often displays local apple events, for example at Rivers Orchard in Sawbridgeworth on September 4 and October 8 and at The Gardens of Easton Lodge on September 25.

#### Citizen Advice

If you are out of work, self-employed, in work on a low income, having a baby, bringing up children, disabled or with a long-term health condition, a carer or an older person you may be entitled to some extra financial help. You have a right to claim your benefit entitlements, and sometimes claiming can also help you access other support, so don't miss out!

You can check what benefits you might be entitled to quickly and easily, using an online benefit calculator such as the one on the UDC website: https://www.uttlesford.gov.uk/article/5078/Online-Benefit--Calculators

If you don't have internet access, or just need a little extra help, call our friendly advisers on 01799 618840 and they will carry out a benefit check for you.

#### **Pension Credit**

Pension Credit gives you extra money to help with your living costs if you're over State Pension age and on a low income and is separate from your state pension. Getting Pension Credit means you could also qualify for other financial support, such as Housing Benefit, a free TV licence and other means-tested benefits. You can claim Pension Credit online, over the phone or by post and will qualify for a higher amount if you're severely disabled or a carer. You can guickly and easily check if you're eligible online https://www.gov.uk/pension-credit--calculator or just give our advisers a call.

#### Benefits for families

Child Benefit can give a big boost to your family budget. You can claim Child Benefit for each child you're responsible for, even if you're working or have savings. You don't have to be their parent to claim. Payments are tax-free as long as neither parent or carer earns more than £50,000 a year. People who have an income between £50,000 and £60,000 will be taxed but will be better off claiming Child Benefit and paying the tax than not claiming benefit at all (bear in mind that pension contributions are an allowable deduction).

If you are off work looking after your child and not paying National Insurance contributions, then claiming Child Benefit will make sure you get credits towards your State Pension. If you've just had a baby, make sure you claim before they are 3 months old. https://www.gov. uk/child-benefit/how-to-claim mes@uttlesfordca.org.uk

Half of the eligible families in Uttlesford are missing out on healthy start vouchers for milk, vitamins and healthy food. These may be

available to you if you are on a low income and are pregnant or have a child under the age of four. You can find out if you are eligible and how you can claim here https://www.healthystart.nhs.uk/ or speak to your midwife or health visitor.

#### Help with household bills & other essential costs

If you're on a low income you might qualify for some help with energy costs or grants to reduce the amount of energy you use. Contact our warm homes team for more information 01799 618858 www.warmhomes@uttlesfordca.org.uk

To help you stay digitally connected, some providers offer low--cost broadband plans if you're getting income-related benefits. https://www.uswitch.com/broadband/guides/broadband-deals-for-low--income-families/

If you've been claiming some income-related benefits for three months, you may be entitled to a Jobcentre Plus Travel Discount Card, which can cut the cost of rail and bus fares by up to 50%. Ask at vour local Jobcentre Plus.

#### If you have a disability or care needs

Personal Independence Payment (PIP) helps with the extra costs of disability or long-term health conditions for people aged 16 and over. It's a non means-tested benefit, so you can get it regardless of how much you earn, or whether you have savings or capital.

If you're caring for someone who's ill or disabled, it can affect your financial situation too. Help is available – you don't have to be related to or live with the person you care for. https://www.gov.uk/browse/ benefits/help-for-carers

#### Help with NHS Costs

You might be able to get free NHS prescriptions, dental treatment, eye tests and help with other NHS costs. The help available depends on your age, income, whether you get certain benefits, if you're pregnant or have a medical condition. To see if you are eligible go to https://www.gov.uk/help-nhs-costs

Our advisers can help check your entitlements and offer support through any application process, should you need it. Our specialist disability benefits team can help with applications for PIP, Attendance Allowance and Disability Living Allowance (for children under 16). Our advice is always free and confidential.




## **Christmas Crafts**

D.I.Y.
SMOW
GLODE

#### What you'll need:

- Figurine or centrepiece
- Glass jar with lid
- PVA/paper glue
- Glitter
- Bottled water
- Glycerin (Optional)



If you don't have a Christmas figurine, try a pine cone!
For a personalised snow globe, you could also use a laminated photo.
Make sure whatever you choose fits on the jar lid and inside the jar.
Check it's waterproof: Place it in a bowl of water for a while and see what happens.
Test the jar's seal. Fill it with water, close it and turn it over - then check for leaks!

Wash your jar with hot, soapy water. Remove labels and remaining glue, and make sure it's totally dry before the next step.

Turn your jar lid upside down, and try placing your figurine in different positions on it. Once you've found an arrangement you like, glue it to the inside of the lid. Allow it to dry somewhere it won't be disturbed - it could take a while!







Fill the jar with bottled water. Leave some room at the top for glycerin, glitter and your centrepiece.

Add a few drops of glycerin or up to a teaspoon for larger jars.
This will make your 'snow' fall more slowly.

Pour 1-2 teaspoons of glitter into the water and put the lid on your jar. Some water may spill if it's a bit too full. If there's any extra space, add more water. Make sure the lid is on tightly. You can glue your jar shut permanently with strong glue if you happen to have some!





Shake it, and enjoy your new snow globe! Display it proudly on a shelf to show it off!

# SHOWMAH CHRISTMAS CARDS



#### What you'll need:

- White card & envelopes
- Black marker
- Orange paper/card
- Black card (optional)
- Coloured card/paper
- Red Pencil
- Glue

Cut a strip of coloured paper 1.5cm wide and glue across the card, leaving sufficient space for a face. Trim to size. Glue another 1.5cm strip (approximately 5-8cm long) to represent the tail of the scarf.



Draw some eyes on some black scrap card, cut out and paste.





Or, draw on eyes using a black marker pen, they don't need to be precise circles (If making with toddlers, then black paint fingerprints would work!).



Draw on a smile of dots, using a black marker.

Draw a conical carrot nose onto a strip of paper (the strip pictured was 4cm wide) - remember to give the carrot a bumpy outline!

#### What you'll need:

- Luggage tags or coloured card (cut into rectangles)
- Pritt stick / PVA glue
- Ribbon
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- Christmas fabric
- Buttons

....and any other craft bits and pieces you can find!

To make these, you can use luggage tags or cut your own shapes (rectangles of 5x9cm work well) of coloured card. Trim two corners diagonally to make the tag shape, then make a hole with your punch and thread it with ribbon (twine, raffia, or string will work). Then comes the fun part...the decorating!

Punch circles out of glitter card with a hole punch and glue them into a Christmas shape.



Cut a tree shape from some Christmas fabric and glue it on your tag, or cover with fabric and paint it! Cut out shapes from old sheet music and glue them on your tags - plus a button on top for the sewing lovers in your life!



# No Need for Speed

Road safety, in particular, speeding is a major concern for Felsted residents, both in the centre of the village and throughout the surrounding hamlets.

With these concerns in mind, at the beginning of June, Natalie Smith, Felsted's new Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) joined with Clare Schorah, the Assistant Clerk to the Parish Council, in a Community Speed Watch session on Chelmsford Road. Both found the experience extremely interesting and they learned a lot about the important work that the group does. PCSO Natalie Smith is hoping to join more sessions in the future.

The Felsted Community Speed Watch is a group of dedicated and trained volunteers who meet regularly at various sites around the parish to monitor speeds. Using approved equipment, the volunteers record the details of vehicles exceeding the speed limit. The details are then passed to the Essex Police, who contact the vehicle owner.

Essex Police also use the evidence provided by the volunteers to identify which communities are suffering poor levels of compliance that would benefit from additional police enforcement.

Working with the police, Felsted's Community Speed Watch group do a brilliant job acting as a deterrent to speeding drivers. They would be able to undertake more of this vital work and make our parish a safer place if there were more volunteers.


