Recipe:

Rhubarb, Rose & Pistachio Crumble

Looking for ideas for what to cook with in-season vegetables and fruit this winter?

Seasonal ingredients include a glittering display of seafood, from mussels to mackerel, as well as fabulous greens, like curly kale and purple sprouting broccoli. Desserts are bright and beautiful, especially with a game-changing February ingredient like tender rhubarb.

Ingredients (Serves 4)

10 green cardamom pods
800g rhubarb, sliced into 2cm pieces
120g soft light brown sugar
1 tsp rosewater
80g unsalted butter, chilled and cubed
80g plain flour
40g oats
2 tbsp sesame seeds
40g shelled pistachios, roughly chopped
Custard, ice cream or cream to serve

Method:

1. Bash open the cardamom pods and discard the green husks. Use a pestle and mortar to grind the black seeds to a powder, then put them in a small pan with the rhubarb, 40g of the sugar and the rosewater.
2. Bring to a simmer and cook for 5 minutes – the rhubarb should be just softening but holding its shape.
3. Transfer to a baking dish.
4. Heat the oven to 160°C fan/Gas mark 4.
5. Rub the butter into the flour until it's a coarse rubble, then stir in the remaining 80g sugar with the oats, sesame seeds, pistachios and a pinch of salt. Sprinkle this topping evenly over the rhubarb.
6. Bake for 20-25 minutes until golden and crisp on top.
7. Serve with custard, ice cream or pouring cream. Or all three!



Discover and Support Felsted Nature Area

Felsted Nature Area is a 40-acre green space behind Station Road, owned by the Parish Council for the enjoyment and benefit of our local community.

Managed to promote biodiversity, it is made up of two large, open grassland areas with public access and the 'restricted access' Felsted Fen – a protected Local Wildlife Site and priority habitat, bounded by the River Chelmer and Stebbing Brook. With well-marked paths, a rich biodiversity and easy accessibility, the Nature Area is a favourite with walkers, dogs and families alike. Parking is available at the Tanton Road car park in Flitch Green (courtesy of Flitch Green Parish Council) and it's a short walk across the bridge. Pedestrian access is also available from Station Road.



Current projects

Our Parish Council is committed to improving the Nature Area for the benefit of the flora, fauna and our local community. Guided by Essex Ecology and a team of wildlife experts, we're putting together a thorough management plan. Regular site visits, surveys, hundreds of newly planted trees and bushes plus grants have all helped us transform each habitat—wetland, river, grassland, fen, ancient woodland, and scrub—so it can thrive for both wildlife and people.

Up to now, much of the maintenance has been done by contractors, but we are increasingly managing it ourselves with volunteers, working alongside local experts.

How to get involved

Ready to make a difference in your community and local environment? There's a role for everyone, whether you're passionate about wildlife, love the outdoors, or simply want to meet new neighbours.

Volunteer: Take part in organised 'work party' days—no experience needed! Help with regular maintenance and habitat management.

Share your vision: Join our steering group for guided walk-rounds and planning. Contribute your ideas for recreation, education and conservation.

Discover and Support Felsted Nature Area

Participate in surveys: Help us monitor birds, butterflies, wild flowers and more.

Report: Simply lend us your eyes and ears. If you visit the Nature Area and notice any maintenance issues or evidence of antisocial behaviour, please let us know by contacting the Parish Clerk at Felsted Parish Council.

Attend events: Join our Spring meeting (date to be advised) to discover more about the history, ongoing works and future plans for the Nature Area.

We look forward to welcoming you—together, we can ensure Felsted Nature Area remains a vibrant community resource for generations to come!

New Car Park/Felsted Primary School

Felsted Parish Council is pleased to advise that a new 90 space car park for the use of Felsted Primary School is nearing completion.

This is being delivered as part of the Sunnybrook housing development following negotiations with the Felsted Neighbourhood Plan Group and should alleviate the twice-daily traffic and parking congestion that has historically occurred around the primary school.

Following some legalities that need finalising, on completion the car park will be transferred into the ownership of the Felsted Community Trust. The trust has agreed licence conditions with the primary school, allowing them use of the car park (at no cost) for parking and child drop-off and collection.

With the co-operation of Uttlesford District Council, a financial contribution towards the provision of future maintenance costs was secured from the developer, Troy Homes, as part of the planning approval.

As soon as the legalities and transfer to the Felsted Community Trust is complete, Felsted Primary School will be able to announce the opening of the car park. Access will be via Foxglove Place, the new road leading into the Sunnybrook Development.





We have lots of good news to share! Firstly, we are delighted to announce that we have successfully applied for an inclusion grant from the local authority. We have secured £20,000, which will help us create an outdoor classroom and sensory garden. We are thrilled that our children will now have this designated space, with work set to begin over the February half-term.



Our second piece of wonderful news relates to OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning). OPAL is a school improvement programme focused on transforming playtimes by giving children more freedom, choice, and resources (both natural and man-made) for creative, active play. This leads to better social skills, well-being, risk management, and reduced behavioural issues, recognising play as crucial learning time, not just downtime. We have been part of OPAL for a few years and achieved Platinum

status in 2023. Recently, we were audited as part of the reaccreditation process. Not only did we maintain our Platinum status, but our audit score also improved from 85% to 97%.

Please see the feedback from our OPAL assessor:

"What a wonderful achievement. I could not be more proud of the dedicated and sustainable play offer the Working Group, Play Team, and whole school continue to provide and create at Felsted Primary School. The environment you have created is truly child-led, engaging, creative, and filled with happiness.

It was an absolute joy to see your playtimes in action. There was so much amazing play happening at lunchtime. I particularly liked watching the children bug hunting and using the large loose parts. It was wonderful to see so many children having such a lovely lunchtime. It's great to see how the school has developed a variety of areas to provide problem-solving and critical thinking opportunities for all children, as well as places for rest and relaxation.

The ability of your play team and all of your children to comprehensively demonstrate the Benefit-Risk process is impressive and well embedded in daily school life.



You have created a happy, joy-filled environment for the children at your school and should be really proud of your achievement. You are now in the top 1% of primary schools in the country who have achieved an OPAL Platinum award, a huge accolade and testament to the quality of your play provision."

We are feeling very positive following these two great pieces of news and are excited to start working on our school singing concert themed "Be Positive!" We are currently working towards our Arts Mark award, which has given us the opportunity to review and develop the arts in our school. The Drama Club is working on The Snow Queen, which will be presented at the end of term. Additional events include a photography exhibition, and our annual art exhibition.

The children and staff continue to put their all into making the school a fantastic place to be!

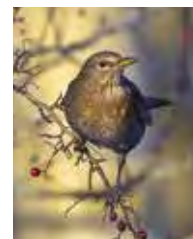

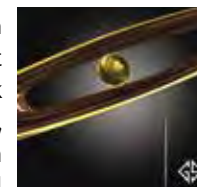

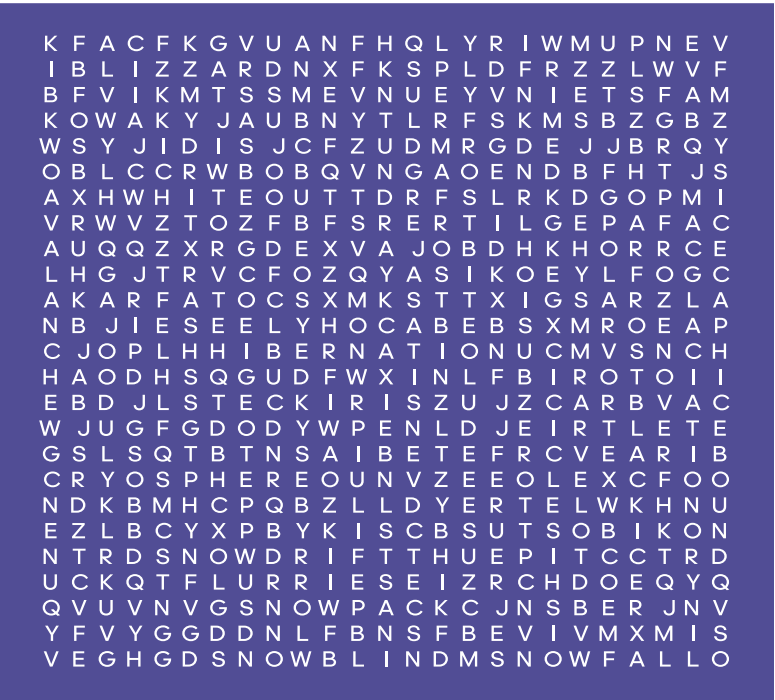
Puzzle Page

A REVOLUTION AHEAD ??! Local Government Reorganisation

Dear Residents

No, there is no need to take to the barricades but Yes, it is the case that radical change (the first for 50 years) to the way that Local Government in Essex is organised is around the corner. This is not something that either your District nor County Councillors have decided should be imposed upon you but is the result of a policy decision taken by Government. This will affect several “Shire Counties”, not just Essex. It will, however, come as some surprise to many residents since this was not anticipated in the Government's Pre-Election 2024 Manifesto.

Under it, Essex County Council will disappear and be replaced by a Greater Essex Mayoral Authority, for which a Mayor will be elected in 2028, when Uttlesford District Council (along with all the other District Councils in the County) will be replaced by a new Unitary Authority. The question as to by which Unitary Authority and how it will be made up is explained below.

What does this mean for us here in Felsted? Well, for the Parish Council, it will be “business as before” since its status and constitution will not be affected.

The Unitary Authority created to replace Uttlesford will provide residents with not only all the services, including social housing, that Uttlesford currently provides but it will also supply residents with schools and education services as well as the adult and young persons' care, currently provided by Essex County Council. The Government's aim is to centralise such services in the hands of Unitaries, rather than have some provided by County and others by District Councils, as at present.

The Government asked Essex County and District Councils to submit their business cases for the creation of Unitaries by the end of September 2025. That was done. It will now be the Government (not the Councils themselves) who will later this Spring decide their number and make up.

What was Uttlesford's preference? I am pleased to say that there was majority agreement reached across the political floor at the Council meeting held last September (24 members in favour, 4 against and 5 abstentions) which was to support, along with nine

other District Councils in the County, the creation of five Unitaries. Essex CC and two other Districts (Epping and Braintree) by contrast favoured the creation of only three.

If the five Unitary model were to be approved, it would mean that the present Districts of Uttlesford, Epping Forest and Harlow would join together to form one Unitary Authority ("West Essex Council") representing some 320,000 people. The business and spatial logic of this structure is derived from the common link provided by the M11 corridor and the significance of Stansted Airport as an economic driver for the three constituent parts. If the three Unitary model promoted by Essex CC were to be favoured by the Government, Uttlesford would instead be joined together with Braintree, Colchester and Tendring Councils, making up a Unitary in excess of 620,000 residents ("North Essex Council").

I personally consider that for our residents, the North Essex model would provide a greater risk of diminished democratic input. Our voice would be less likely to be heard within such a large Council representing so many people. Also, we have seen Braintree, Colchester and Tendring Councils previously acting together, about 10 years ago, in what might have appeared to our residents then to be a "predatory" manner in that they promoted the development of 10,000 new houses in what was to be called "West of Braintree Garden Community" (actually mainly at Andrewsfield). Not only would this have directly affected Great Saling and Stebbing for the worst but also Felsted by the resulting change of local character and adverse burden on local infrastructure. A repeated threat of this scenario could better be resisted by combining with Epping Forest and Harlow, the latter of which wants development to come its way.

At a local level, under the five Unitary model, there would be 83 Councillors required, of whom 25 would represent Uttlesford electors. This compares with the total of 43 currently representing Uttlesford. Our ward of Felsted and Stebbing would be reorganised and made up by a new combined ward of Felsted, Stebbing, Flitch Green and Little Dunmow, with two councillors likely to be required, ie one councillor for 3,000 voters. Under the three Unitary model, there would be fewer councillors elected, amounting to about one for 4,800 voters. So, all proposed arrangements would involve a reduced level of democratic accountability in the sense of there being fewer elected councillors than at present but

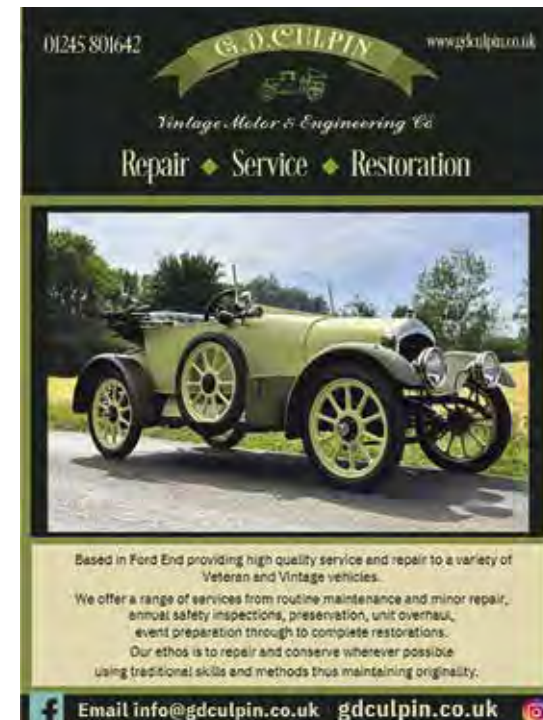
this would be significantly more the case in the three Unitary model than the five.

If any resident has any questions or issues to raise on this article (or of course any other subject) I will be very pleased to hear from them. A detailed monthly report to Felsted Parish Council is available, authored by me since being elected as your District Councillor in May 2019, through the link appearing under the Minutes of each Parish Council meeting. This contains up to date information as to what is going on in the District policy wise and I encourage readers to spare time to read and I hope enjoy it !

The Hundred Parishes



The Hundred Parishes Society is not a church or religious organisation but we encourage visits to churches because they are often the oldest and most interesting building in any community. Most of our churches are open regularly and welcome visitors.

Our website www.hundredparishes.org.uk has many short articles, including some about various aspects of churches including bells, clocks, memorials, poppyheads, spires, towers and windows. We recently added an article about church fonts, some of which appears in the next few paragraphs.

Fonts hold holy water which is used to 'baptise' people, an initiation into the Christian faith. They are often situated near the church entrance. Our local churches have a great variety of fonts, usually made of stone. For example ...

St. George's church in Anstey has an 11th-century font that is rare in that it is decorated with mermen (the male equivalent of mythical mermaids) holding their tails.

Thorley church has a 12th-century font. It was removed from the church and for many years was used as a drinking trough on a nearby farm before being reintroduced into the church in 1855. Its ornate cover was designed by George Gilbert Scott, a prolific architect known mainly for his work designing and renovating churches and cathedrals.

Chickney church has a carved stone font from the 14th century. The bowl is lavishly decorated including shields bearing the coats of arms of local Braybrook and Fitzwalter families.

Debden's 18th-century font is made of Coade stone and is richly decorated with roses and heraldry.

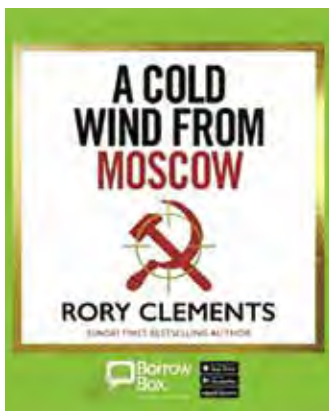
